Coming up on March 20 at 2pm, CSAC presents Juno award winning Phil Dwyer and his son Ben Dwyer!

Phil Dwyer is a Member of the Order Of Canada, an Honorary Fellow of the Royal Conservatory of Music and the winner of multiple Juno Awards and nominations. He has enjoyed an illustrious 30+ year career as a performer, composer/arranger, and educator. Over that period he has collaborated with some of the greatest names in jazz, classical and pop music. Phil is one of the most recorded musicians in Canada, and has performed at major music festivals and venues in over 30 countries on 4 continents. He is currently in his second year of Law at UNB.

The “Dwyer Duo” features Canadian jazz legend Phil Dwyer (piano/saxophone) and up-and-coming Montreal bassist Ben Dwyer. Together they have dazzled audiences from Vancouver Island to PEI with their telepathic renditions of classic material from the Great American Songbook.
